- 1 that following recent issues at Waikato University a collective approach across the country's eight universities was underway to address racism and consider Treaty conversations.
- 2 that the DVC Māori will work with the Committee to develop a selfassessment in line with the eight principles in this University's Treaty statute. The Committee will consider a draft self-review document at its May meeting for further consideration by Council in June.
