DAY OF ARRIVAL INTO WELLINGTON

1.00–2.30 pm	Visit to New Zealand Parliament 'How Parliament Works' provides students with an introduction to the workings of the parliament including discussion about the structure, origins and the impact it has on our lives. Relevant venues within the Parliament Buildings will be visited.
3.00–4.30 pm	Visit the Reserve Bank The Reserve Bank offers an interactive presentation on the Bank's three core functions: issuing currency, managing inflation, and maintaining financial stability. This is followed by a discussion on the causes, costs, and management of inflation.

9.00–10.45 am	Visit The Treasury The Treasury introduces students to the idea that the public sector is relevant to all New Zealanders and the field of economics is an exciting area to be a part of. Treasury graduates deliver this session which includes a budget making activity for students and an overview of the economic environment, NZ budget considerations, relationship with government and what it's like to work at the Treasury.
