



MASTER OF NURSING PRACTICE

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The Master of Nursing Practice (MNursPrac) is a two-year Master's degree that allows you to transition into a career in nursing.

The MNursPrac will provide you with the skills required to support people to stay healthy and face health challenges. Those skills include nursing care, hauora Māori, applied pathophysiology, research for practice, and 1,100 hours of clinical experience.

Completion of the MNursPrac and the State Final Examination will allow you to practice as a registered nurse in Aotearoa New Zealand.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- A Bachelor's degree with at least a B+ average in the final year of study
- To meet the good character and health standards of the Nursing Council of New Zealand

You will also need to meet set criteria, including successfully participating in a selection interview, having the ability to travel to clinical placements, making a declaration about any criminal convictions, providing proof of appropriate immunisation status, and completing a certified basic life-support course.
