## PREPARE FOR UNIVERSITY STUDY

When you finish your EAP study successfully, you are given a Certificate of Proficiency in English (CertEngProf). This certificate shows that your English skills will allow you to study at Victoria University of Wellington\*.

Students are placed in one of two programmes depending on their level and goal:

	IELTS equivalent
EAP for Undergraduate and Postgraduate Study	6.0
EAP for Postgraduate Study (advanced)	6.5

\*Requirements for some programmes vary.

Your EAP results will be accepted as an alternative to IELTS or TOEFL by Victoria University of Wellington and most other New Zealand universities.

# PROGRAMME INFORMATION

The EAP programme has three key entry points each year and has been designed to cater for a range of student goals.

<b>DATES</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>► <b>Trimester 1:</b> Late February to mid-May</li><li>► <b>Trimester 2:</b> Late June to September</li><li>► <b>Trimester 3:</b> Late September to December</li></ul>
<b>DURATION</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>► Each trimester is 12 weeks (60 points)</li><li>► 20 hours per week in class</li></ul>
<b>PROGRESSION</b>	In one trimester, students generally go up by 0.5 on the IELTS scale. Students might need to study for two or more trimesters in a row to reach the level needed for university study.
<b>CLASS SIZE</b>	Small groups of 10–15 students
<b>EAP ENTRY REQUIREMENTS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>► You need to have a pre-intermediate level of English—at least Duolingo 70, IELTS 4.5, or TOEFL iBT 34.</li><li>► You will need to submit your English test results with your application. If you do not have English test results, contact us for a free online test.</li></ul>

## HOW YOU'LL STUDY

The EAP programme is full time and based at the University's Kelburn campus. You will have 20 hours a week of class work and also some independent study.

Your class work includes:


- listening to talks and academic lectures, taking part in discussions, reading effectively, and writing essays or reports
- demonstrating critical thinking while writing, reading, listening, and speaking
- studying grammar and university vocabulary
- developing fluency and building confidence
- taking regular tests to check your progress.

Outside regular class hours, you'll have access to high-quality equipment and learning resources at the University's libraries.
