## FINANCIAL REPORT TO 31 OCTOBER 2023

- that in May the full year underlying forecast for the University group was a deficit of \$33m.
- that the current full year underlying forecast for the University group is a deficit of \$29m. With two months of activity remaining the result could alter however a substantial underlying loss will still occur.
- 4 that the Kaikoura earthquake proceeds have resulted in a \$40.8m nonrecurring benefit that must be treated as revenue. The CFO emphasised that these funds will be required for seismic remediation.
- 5 that when the claim proceeds are included, the year to date University Group result is a surplus of \$17m. If the claim proceeds are excluded, the year to date University group deficit is \$22.3m.
