## 23.04 REPORT FROM THE CHANCELLOR

- 2 that the untimely death of former Vice-Chancellor, Emeritus Professor Stuart McCutcheon, was noted with great sadness. His contribution to this University and the tertiary sector overall was recognised for its impact and significance.
- that the death of former Director of the Centre for Strategic Studies, Terence O'Brien was recorded. Mr O'Brien was particularly remembered for his contribution to the University as a staff member and subsequently as a strong supporter and friend.
- 4 that the challenging financial environment remains, with lower-thanexpected 2023 student enrolment numbers. Other factors include a strong job market and opportunities for international travel along with the cost of living in Wellington having an impact.
- that the importance of having staff and students back on campus whilst providing a dynamic, stimulating and enriching in-person experience will be a key strategic focus during the year.
- that for students the importance of face-to-face lectures and tutorials and participation in the many social and educational opportunities available cannot be underestimated. The University is much more than a content provider, we are educators.
- 7 that the closure of VicBooks and the impact of this on staff, students and the wider community was acknowledged. Every effort is being made to find a replacement operator to ensure that this important aspect of a full experience on campus can continue.

that in Professor Smith's first formal report to Council since starting in the role on 16 January 2023, he highlighted three main themes:

Core strategic goals

How do we re-energise the University community and what does it mean to be a place-based institution? Thinking about the wider context, the devastating loss of Vic Books is an indicator that if we don't see engaged staff and students back on campus there will be further losses of things that enrich the campus experience.

Constraints

The entire tertiary sector is constrained by government financial policy and is also showing the effects of nearly three years of the COVID-19 pandemic. The University's enrolment figures are confronting and there is no question that the pipeline is diminishing. Students are also particularly hard hit by the cost-of-living crisis currently affecting the country. Attributing all of the current difficulties to the new Admissions system is unfair, however it has not helped. The Acting Chief Operating Officer has led a task force to focus entirely on admitting and enrolling as many students as possible. The efforts of staff who have participated above and beyond to maximise enrolment opportunities were acknowledged.

University rankings

These are an anodyne fact of the University landscape allowing measures to be constructed cheaply and at a distance. Despite this, they are an important driver of international student University selection process. As part of considering what is distinctive/valuable about this University the time is right to determine our distinctive strengths and how best to invest in those in a constrained environment.

#### SPEAKER: MS BARBARA MCKERROW, CHIEF EXECUTIVE, 23.15 WELLINGTON CITY COUNCIL
