Received: a Council paper from the Chancellor, Mr John Allen, dated 11 September

2023 (document VUWC 23/95).

that this is a challenging time for Council and all members of our University community as the final decisions are made on the proposal for change to ensure the University's financial sustainability.

that the Chancellor thanked everyone for continuing to operate professionally throughout this time to deliver for the University's students.

- 4 that the University's Open Day held late August was well attended by potential students and their whanau. A concerted effort by staff across the University's campuses generated a buzz of enthusiasm and possibility.

REPORT FROM THE VICE-CHANCELLOR

Received:

a report from the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Nic Smith, dated 11 September 2023 (document VUWC 23/96).

Noted:

- 1 that the report was taken as read.
- that the consultation period for feedback to be given on our proposed changes to academic programmes and staffing levels in some CSUs and faculties closed on Tuesday 5 September 2023. There was strong engagement with the process by staff with a total of 199 submissions on roles proposed for disestablishment.
- that Phase 3 of our consultation process is nearly completed, with the final decision document due to be published on Thursday 21 September 2023.
- that the Vice-Chancellor will hold a series of staff forums on Thursday 21 September and Friday 22 September to discuss the outcomes with the University community.
- 5 that there is a university-wide focus on enrolment for 2024.
- that the University will host an education -focused debate with candidates from five of NZ's political parties in late September.
- 7 that the University held an outstanding Open day in late August.
- 8 that the Vice-Chancellor encouraged everyone to attend the Election Debate on 28 September in the Hub.
- 9 that the Vice-Chancellor thanked the University community for the submissions (over 800) received. He also thanked the leadership and the HR team who have done extraordinary work under very tight time pressure.
- that the process has been as thorough as possible. There have been multiple submissions received suggesting alternative ways to make savings to help achieve the financial sustainability of the University. These have been actively considered.
- that the largest number of redundancies are from the Chief Operating Officer portfolio.
- that Professor Arnold thanked the Vice-Chancellor for the consultation process that was delivered as promised.
- that the Chancellor recognised the significant amount of work that has been undertaken in this process and thanked the Vice-Chancellor who has shouldered a large amount of the load.

ACADEMIC BOARD ADVICE – FINANCIAL SUSTAINABILITY PROPOSAL

Received:

- a Council paper from Professor Peter Whiteford on behalf of Academic Board, dated 22 August 2023 regarding the Academic Implications of the "Achieving Financial Sustainability" proposal (document VUWC 23/98).
- an oral report from Professor Peter Whiteford following the Special meeting of the Academic Board held on Thursday 14 September 2023, providing further advice.

Noted:

- that the Chancellor acknowledged Professor Whiteford's willingness to report back on the Academic Board meeting to Council.
- that concerns had been raised at the Academic Board meeting about the depth of information provided to explain the decisions outlined in the decision document and the amount of time available to Academic Board to consider them. Some felt they could not provide the advice sought because of this. Nevertheless, some specific new concerns were voiced which Professor Whiteford itemised to Council as follows:
 - a. the situation of postgraduate research students (especially those undertaking a PhD) remains quite uncertain. Some have been told they are likely to lose one or both of their supervisors, and their ongoing supervision remains problematic;
 - b. admission of new doctoral candidates who applied in July is equally problematic if supervision arrangements cannot be known in advance;
 - the impact of losing current doctoral candidates or failing to attract new candidates will be significant in terms of EFTS, but equally in terms of the research output of the University (and consequentially on PBRF outcomes);
 - d. there is a considerable risk of internal competition for EFTS as a consequence of the narrow focus on individual programmes, and such competition would inhibit interdisciplinary activities and developments;
 - e. concern was raised about the proposal to reduce the opening hours of the libraries at Pipitea and Te Aro campuses. This will have a detrimental impact on student access to library services, especially for those students who are part-time.
 - f. In addition to the above specific concerns, a general theme in the questions and comments around the continued lack of transparency with some key parts of the process.

- that Professor Bönisch-Brednich, as one of two staff representatives on Council, thanked Professor Whiteford, for speaking on behalf of Academic Board.
- that the Vice-Chancellor reinforced the acute need to press on with the process due to the requirement to release details to prospective students of our calendar for 2024, and to address the continuing financial pressure on the University.

2024 DOMESTIC TUITION FEES

Received:

a Council paper from the Chief Financial Officer, Mr Les Montgomery, dated 6 September 2023, regarding 2024 Domestic Tuition Fees (document VUWC 23/100).

2024 STUDENT SERVICES LEVY

 - \$4.60 per point for distance students outside Wellington (This is the equivalent of a 7% increase);
