Professor David Shambaugh, Elliot School of International Affairs, George Washington University

Bio: Professor Shambaugh is recognized internationally as an authority on contemporary Chinese affairs and the international politics and security of the Asia-Pacific region. He is a widely published author of numerous books, articles, book chapters, and newspaper editorials.

Professor Shen Dingli, Institute of International Relations, Fudan University

Bio: Professor Shen Dingli, a physicist by training, is a professor of international relations at Fudan University. He is the Executive Dean of Fudan University's Institute of International Studies, and Director of Center for American Studies. He is also the founder and director of China's first non-government-based Program on Arms Control and Regional Security at Fudan University.

Professor Sam Zhao, Josef Korbel School of International Studies, University of Denver

Bio: Suisheng (Sam) Zhao is Professor and Executive Director of the Center for China-US Cooperation at the Josef Korbel School of International Studies, University of Denver. He is a member of the Board of Governors of the US Committee for the Council for Security Cooperation in the Asia Pacific (USCSCAP), a member of the National Committee on US-China Relations, a Research Associate at the Fairbanks Center for East Asian Research in Harvard University, and an honorary jianzhi professor at Beijing University, Renmin University, Fudan University, and Shanghai Foreign Studies University.

Professor Jin Canrong, School of International Relations, Renmin University of China

Bio: Professor Jin Canrong is a professor and Associate Dean with the School of International Studies at Renmin University of China. He is also a visiting professor at the Gerald Ford School of Public Policy, University of Michigan and the "Weilun" Chair Professor at Tsinghua University
