PAPER PRESCRIPTION

Development of knowledge and technical ability on the student's selected instrument to an intermediate standard and on piano to a basic standard through individual lessons, workshops and self-directed learning.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

At the end of this paper the student should be able to:

1. Demonstrate performer techniques and perform as a competent ensemble musician and as a soloist
2. Demonstrate memorisation of specified tunes from the first year repertoire (melody and chords)
3. Transcribe and perform prescribed solos
4. Recognise and play on the keyboard; common chords, common chord progressions and simple melodies.
5. Demonstrate competency on percussion in Afro-Cuban and Brazilian musical contexts and percussion ensembles (drummers only).

ASSESSMENT REQUIREMENTS

This paper is 100% internally assessed.

The weightings for assessment are:

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| 1. Final assessment (Drummers) | 90% |
| 2. Final assessment (all other instrumentalists and singers) | 100% |
| 3. Keyboard Proficiency (except pianists) | 0% |
| 4. Percussion Workshop (drummers only) | 0% |

The assessment varies according to specialisation so that all appropriate learning outcomes are addressed (refer to assessment schedules).

Students must satisfactorily complete all required components, attend performance workshop, perform in performance workshop 4 times (twice each trimester), and achieve above 50% for their final recital. Note that in order to progress to PERF 220, a B- grade or better is required in this paper.

Dates assignments are due/ dates of in-class tests

The final assessment schedule will be posted mid-way through Trimester 2.

MANDATORY PAPER REQUIREMENTS

Completing all the assessment items and attending at least 80% of your lectures and tutorials are a mandatory requirement for this paper. If for health reasons you are unable to complete all the work required for assessment purposes by 12 November 2008 you may, on presentation of a medical certificate, have the date for submission extended by the Director of the New Zealand School of Music.
