PAPER PRESCRIPTION

Development of jazz skills to a professional level for small ensemble (combo), and large ensemble (big band) playing (jazz choir for vocalists).

LEARNING OUTCOMES

By the end of the paper the student should be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate increasing knowledge of their chosen instrument / voice
- 2. Demonstrate improved performing ability on their chosen instrument / voice
- 3. Demonstrate an awareness of both individual and group dynamics and rhythm
- 4. Demonstrate the role(s) of his/her instrument / voice in a specified setting and awareness of the roles of other instruments in a combo and big band.
- 5. Apply skills learned in Jazz Theory and Improvisation and be able to improvise by memory on their chosen instrument / voice to a professional level, according to the style and period of the piece from the prescribed repertoire and extended repertoire.
- 6. Demonstrate increasing skill in sight reading of specified charts.
- 7. Play specified tunes by memory including the playing of arpeggios and soloing over the chord progression.

EXPECTED WORKLOAD

A 10-point full-year performance paper should require at least 120 hours work. This means that in term time, the midterm breaks and study weeks you should be prepared to spend an average of at least four hours a week attending lessons, classes, workshops or rehearsals as appropriate, and practising.

PAPER CONTENT

Combo and Repertoire Combo cover ensemble playing skills, including soloing, leading, and comping. Big Band covers sightreading and large jazz ensemble skills.

MATERIALS

All materials will be provided.

ASSESSMENT REQUIREMENTS

This paper is 100% internally assessed.

There are three items of assessment:

- 1. Performance by memory of prescribed repertoire: 70%
- 2. Participation in Repertoire Combo: 0%
- 3. Participation in Big Band / Choir: 30%

Assessment item 1 relates to learning outcome 7 and assessment items 2 and 3 relate to learning outcomes 1-6.

Students must pass all modules to achieve a pass in this paper.

Students must attend a minimum of 80% of classes. All students must arrange substitute players for classes they are unable to attend.

MANDATORY PAPER REQUIREMENTS

Completing all the assessment items and attending at least 80% of your classes and rehearsals are mandatory requirements for this paper. If for health reasons you are unable to complete all the work required for assessment purposes for this Paper by 27 October, you may, on presentation of a medical certificate, have the date for submission extended by the Director, NZSM. If you can not be present for a rehearsal, you must organise a substitute player.
