Tuatahi kia eke ake ngā tauira o te wānanga ki te ikeketanga o te reo, kia mārama pū ki ngā kupu whakanikoniko i whaohipa ki ngā waiaita tawhito, ngā karakia, ngā haka, ngā ngeri, ngā pōkeka, ngā tūmoto, ngā tauparapara, ngā whaikorero, ngā whakataukī, ngā pūrākau, ngā karanga, ngā pūrākau, pakiwaitara a kui mā a koro mā. Ko te mea nui kia whakaarohipa te taumata o te reo tuhi me te reo kōrero e tika ana hei eketanga mā tātau, otirā, me pēhea e paku kātata atu ai ki tā rātau i whakatauira mai.

5 NGĀ AROMATAWAI

5.1 Te Mahere Aromatawai

Ngā Mahi	Te Wā Kati	Wāriu	Te rahi me te roa o ngā mahi
Taumahi 1	15 o Ākuhata	30%	3000 mano kupu
Taumahi 2	12 o Hepetema	30%	3000 mano kupu
Tuari Kaupapa	17 o Oketopa	10%	20 meneti
Taumahi 3	31 o Oketopa	30%	3000 mano kupu

E toru ngā tuhinga roa hei tuhituhi mā tēnā, mā tēnā e hipa ai koutou i te akoranga nei.

5.1.1 Tuhingaroa Tuatahi

Whiwhinga 30%

Tohua he waiata mai tou iwi, rangahaua, wetewetea, tātarihia anō nei ko koe taua kaitito. Na reira me tino matatau koe ki te kaitito, anō nei ko koe. Kia mau i a koe te wairua, ngā whakaaro o te kaitito. He aha te kaupapa i titoa ai? Whakamāramahia he aha ngā tohu e whakaatu ana i te āhua o taua wā.

5.1.2 Tuhinga Tuarua

Whiwhinga 30%

He mea pōhiri koe ki te tuku kauhau ki tetahi hui nui o te ao na te mea ko koe te tohunga mo taua kaupapa, kare i tua atu i a koe. Te whakataukī, he pēhea tā te Māori whakamahi i tēnei tūāhua whakatakoto kōrero. He aha te/ngā hua o te whakataukī. Whakaritea he kaupapa e whakaatu ana i to tohungatanga ki ngā āhua katoa o te whakataukī.

5.1.3 Tuari Kaupapa

Whiwhinga 10%

Tohua mai tētahi o ngā kaupapa tuhinga roa, titonga kōrero whakanikongo kua whakaritea e koe ka tuari ki te wānanga. Me kapi katoa i a koe ngā āhuatanga matua o tō kaupapa. Kaua e wareware he whakarāpopototanga noa tēnei o tō kaupapa. Haere ki te matū o ngā kōrero kia ranonga tō tohungatanga ki tō kaupapa. He rua tekau meneti te roa, ka whai atu ngā uiuinga a te minenga whakarongo.

5.1.4 Tuhinga Tuatoru

Whiwhinga 30%

Tuhia, titoa he waiata, haka, ngeri, mōteatea, whaikōrero, karanga, pūrākau, ko tōna taumata kia eke ki te taumata o ngā tohunga. Ko te tauira hei whāinga kia ūrite ki ngā Moteatea. Me whakapākehā hoki ki taua taumata. Ko te mea nui kia mau te wairua Māori, i takea mai i ngā pūmanawa o te ao Māori, kīhai i te ao Pākehā.

5.2 Te Kawa o ngā Mahi

I tua atu o te taumahi tuatoru e whakapākehātia ai e koe taua kaupapa ko te reo Maori anake te reo o tēnei wānanga.

6 KO NGĀ WHIU

Ki te kore e tutuki i a koe ngā whakaritenga mō ia tatauranga, kāore koe e hipa i tēnei karaihe. Me ūmai te katoa o ngā mahi i te rā kua whakaritea. Ka tangohia 5% mō ia rā ki te tōmuri. Me kōrero ki te Pūkenga, māna anake e whakarite he wā e taea ai te whakaoti tika i ū mahi. Kauā e haere i te ara a taihoa, ka tae ki aua atu!

7 NGĀ MAHI ME TUTUKI

- Me tae mai ki ngā wānanga katoa
- Me oti ia mahi aro matawai, ka mutu me eke ki te taumata o te 50% neke atu
- Me eke ki te taumata paerua mō te whakaniko kōrero.

8 TE KAUPAPA TUAKANA/TEINA

He mea nui te āwhina i ētahi atu, arā i ngā ‘teina’ i roto i ngā mahi ako i te reo. I te mea ko koutou ngā tuākana he karanga tēnei kia tautoko koutou i te kaupapa nei, Tuakana/Teina. He āwhina anō hoki tēnei i a koe ki te whakapakari i tōu ake reo! Nā reira whakapā atu ki a Ani-Piki Tuari:

9 MŌ TE HUNGA HAUĀ

He ture tā te Whare Wānanga e pā ana ki ngā tāngata hauā. He ture mō ngā whakamātautau me ērā atu o ngā aromatawai. Me kōrero ki te Pūkenga mēnā ka whaihua tēnei ki a koe.

10 KO NGĀ WĀNANGA – TE MAHERE MAHI

10.1 Wānanga 1: Rāmere 24 – Rātapu 26 o Hūrae

Te Whakatakoto i te Mahere Ako mo tēnei kaupapa. He whakawhanaunga, he mihimihī:

- ngā kōrero whakanikoniko, whakanakonako, he wherawhera

- he wetewete i ētahi o ngā waiata a kui mā, a koro mā
- he tito kōrero whakanikoniko, whakanakonako.

10.2 Wānanga 2: Rāmere 21 – Rātapu 23 o Ākuhata

Te reo ītereere o ngā tīpuna:

- he wetewhete, he tātari i ngā tuhinga a ngā tīpuna
- he wetewete, he tātari i ngā tuhinga a ngā kaituhi i te reo i ēnei rā
- he wānanga i ngā rerekētanga.

10.3 Wānanga 3: Rāmere 18 – Rātapu 20 o Hepetema

Te whakamāori i te kupu kōrero:

- he tirotiro, he tātari, he wewete, i ngā tūāhua whakamāori i te kupu
- te Whakapākeha i te kupu.

10.4 Wānanga 4: Rāmere 16 – Rātapu 18 o Oketopa

- he whakatepe, he whakakapi, he whakahīato i ngā whakakitenga i puta mai i roto i ngā taumahi. He tuari i ngā rangahau.

13 ENROLMENT AND WITHDRAWAL DEADLINES

Have you changed your mind about the courses you want to do this trimester? If you do not withdraw from a course in time, you will receive a fail grade. A fail grade stays permanently on your academic record. You can avoid the fail grade by withdrawing properly from courses before it is too late!

It is not enough just to stop attending lectures and tutorials, or to tell your lecturer or school administrator. You must complete a Course Add/Drop form, available from your Faculty Student and Academic Services Office, and submit it by the following deadlines.

Second Trimester Courses, July to October 2009

No addition of second trimester courses permitted after **Friday, 24 July 2009**.

If you withdraw before **Friday, 24 July 2009** you will get a full refund of fees.

The last date for withdrawal from second trimester courses (without refund) before Associate Dean's approval is required is **Friday, 25 September 2009**.
