### 4.3 Ko te Nui o Ngā Mahi

Kei te taumata tau tuarua tēnei akoranga, nā reira e tika ana kia pau i a koe te 200 hāora i tēnei wāhanga o te tau, arā he tata ki te 14 hāora ia wiki. Nō reira, i tūa atu o ngā akomanga whānui (4 hāora ia wiki) me ngā akomanga whāiti (1 hāora ia wiki) me kī e 9 hāora kei te toe māu hai whakarite mō ngā mahi mō tēnei karaehe. Anei pea he tauira hai whakarite i aua hāora kei te toe:

- te pānui i ngā kōrero i mua i ia karaehe (2-4 hāora)
- te whakahou i ngā kōrero i puta i ngā akomanga (2-4 hāora)
- te whakarite kōrero mō ngā aromatawai (3-4 hāora)
- te ako kupu hou, rerenga hou rānei (1-2 hāora).

Nā reira ka kite i runga ake nei, ehara i te mea me haere poka noa mai ki ngā akomanga o Tū Tū te Wana, me whakarite tika nei i a koe, i ō whakaaro, i tō hinengaro i āu mahi katoa, kia māmā ake tō hopu i ngā kōrero, i ngā mahi i roto i tēnei akomanga.

#### 5.1 Kōrero Tene (5% + 15%)

##### Kōrero Tene Tuatahi (5%)

Ka whakahaeretia tēnei ki roto i ngā akomanga whāiti hei te wiki tuawhā (**9 o Hereturikōkā 2012**). Me eke te kōrero tene ki te rima meneti, ā, kia kaua e roa atu i te ono meneti. Ki te kore e eke ki te rima meneti e 2% te whiu mai i te kaute tōpū. Mā te kaiako e whakarite te kaupapa kōrero, ka tukuna ki a koe e rima meneti i mua tata i tō tū.

##### Kōrero Tene Tuarua (15%)

Ka whakahaeretia tēnei ki roto i te akomanga whānui tuatahi o te wiki 12 arā hei te **17 o Whiringa-ā-nuku 2012**. Me eke te kōrero ki te waru meneti, ā, kia kaua e roa atu i te 10 meneti. Ki te heke iho i te waru meneti e 5% te whiu mai i te kaute tōpū. Mā te kaiako e whakarite te kaupapa kōrero ka tukuna ki a koe e waru meneti i mua tata i tō tū.

Ko ngā paearu o ngā mahi nei ka aro matawai i ngā kaupapa e whai ake nei:

- te kaha o te tauira ki te whakamahi i ngā kupu hou, rerenga kōrero hou kua akohia i roto i te akomanga
- te whakahua o te reo
- te rere o te reo
- te tika o te reo

- te hāngai ki te kaupapa.

## 5.2 Ngā Whakamātautau Whāiti 40% (20% + 20%)

Ka whakahaeretia ki roto i te akomanga whānui hei ngā wiki 6 (**22 o Hereturikōkā**), 12 (**15 o Whiringa-ā-nuku**) hoki. E rua hāora te roa o ia whakamātautau whāiti. He 20% ūrau mō te whakamātautau tuatahi, he 20% ūrau mō te whakamātautau tuarua. Ko te whāīnga matua o ia whakamātautau whāiti he aro matawai i te akonga ki ngā mahi whakarongo, pānui, tuhituhi hoki, ā, ka ahu mai i ngā kaupapa whakaako i roto i ngā akomanga whānui.

## 5.3 Tuhingaroa 20%

Kotahi anake te tuhingaroa. Ko tōna nui kia kaua e iti iho i te 2,000 kupu (hāunga ko ngā tohu pūtake rangahau), kia kaua hoki e nui ake i te 2,200 kupu. Me rangahau te akonga i ngā momo kōrero e pā ana ki tētahi o ēnei kaupapa e whai ake nei:

## 5.4 Kauhau 20%

Ka whakahaeretia tēnei kaupapa ki roto i te noho marae ka tū i te Wiki 9: **Tūrei 25 o Mahuru**. E 10 meneti te roa, e 2 meneti mō ngā pātai. Ko te kaupapa o tō kauhau he whakaatu i ō kitenga i roto i te tuhinga roa. Kaua e pānui i tō tuhinga roa, engari ka ahu mai tō kauhau i ō rangahau mō tēnei kaupapa. Me whakarite he whakaaturanga-ā-rorohiko (PowerPoint presentation), hai āwhina, hai whakawhānui i te tīpuna nāna ngā kōrero.

Koinei ngā wāhi matua ka whakamātauhia e te kaiako:

- te kaha o te tauira ki te hanga kauhau mai i āna rangahau, tāna tuhinga roa

## **6 KO NGĀ WHIU**

Inā, i oti i a koe tō mahi, ā, i tukuna hoki i te wā e tika ana engari kāore i eke rawa tō māka ki te rima tekau paiheneti ka āhei koe ki te tuku anō i tō aromataawai ki te kaiako. Heoi, ki te tuarua tō tuku mai i tētahi aromataawai e kore e eke i te rima tekau paiheneti te kaute tōpū mō taua aromataawai. Me kōrero ki te Pūkenga, māna anake e whakarite he wā e taea ai te whakaoti tika i ū mahi.

Ki te kore e tutuki i a koe ngā whakaritenga mō ia aromataawai, kāore koe e hipa i tēnei karaihe. Me ū mai te katoa o ngā mahi i te rā kua whakaritea. Ka tangohia 5% mō ia rā ki te tōmuri. Me kōrero ki te Pūkenga, māna anake e whakarite he wā e taea ai te whakaoti tika i ū mahi. Kauā e haere i te ara a taihoa, ka tae ki aua atu!
