# Prescription

GREE 113 is a study of ancient Greek, assuming basic reading skills, with emphasis on the reading of texts in Attic Greek.

#### **Course content**

This class will start with a brief revision of *Athenaze* ch.  $1-9^{\alpha}$ . From there we will continue with *Athenaze* books 1 and 2.

### Course learning objectives (CLOs)

Students who pass this course should be able to:

- 1. demonstrate knowledge of the basic vocabulary, morphology, and grammar of ancient Greek;
- 2. read elementary Greek texts (often, but not always with the aid of a dictionary and grammar);
- 3. identify and discuss linguistic concepts pertaining to ancient Greek;
- 4. continue the study of ancient Greek in GREE 215.

### **Teaching format**

This course is taught via a seminar format in which the lecturer explains Greek grammar, vocabulary, and translation. Students participate fully in all activities, including reading and translating sentences and passages and writing answers on the whiteboard. Students are expected to bring all homework exercises, completed in advance, to class.

#### Mandatory course requirements

In addition to achieving an overall pass mark of 50%, students must:

- 1. sit all five quizzes;
- 2. sit the final examination.

#### Workload

The average student should expect to spend *ca.* 200 hours in total on GREE 113. This equates to thirteen hours per week during term-time, including four hours per week for classes and in-class assessments and nine hours per week for self-directed study outside class; and forty-four hours of revision for assessment, particularly the final examination.

#### Assessment

#### GREE 113 consists of **50% internal assessment** and **50% examination**.

Assessments in GREE 113 are designed to evaluate progress in three key areas, as well as to provide a final grade:

- memorisation of vocabulary and grammatical points, tested by questions on morphology;
- understanding of how vocabulary and grammar are used, tested by the translation of simple sentences of Greek to English or English to Greek;
- reading ability, tested by the translation of and/or questions on passages of Greek.
- Quizzes 10% each = 50% Five fifteen-minute quizzes, to be taken in class, counting 10% each.

The quizzes will take place on **Tuesdays** of weeks 3, 5, 7, 9 and 11.

#### • Examination 50%
