Course learning objectives (CLOs)

- 1. perform in Latin jazz styles to an advanced level
- 2. perform from memory selected tunes from the standard Latin jazz repertoire
- 3. show advanced understanding of the idiosyncratic features of Latin jazz
- 4. arrange or transcribe material from the jazz repertoire for Latin Jazz ensemble employing appropriate idiomati/stylistic elements and conventions.

Teaching format

This course comprises two 1.5-hour lectures per week.

Mandatory course requirements

In addition to achieving an overall pass mark of 50%, students must:

a) attend 100% of rehearsals.

Due to the interdependence of all participants in the ensemble, 100% attendance is required unless prior approval has been given by the lecturer or a medical certificate is produced verifying illness. Unapproved absences will reduce the achievable mark by 8.33% each (1/12th of the course).

Any student who is concerned that they have been (or might be) unable to meet any of the mandatory course requirements because of exceptional personal circumstances, should contact the course coordinator as soon as possible.

Workload

A 15-point one-trimester course should require at least 150 hours work (including class time). This means that during the trimester, the mid-trimester break and study week you should be prepared to spend on average 10 hours per week involved in activities such as attending classes, reading, listening to recommended recordings and preparing assignments.
