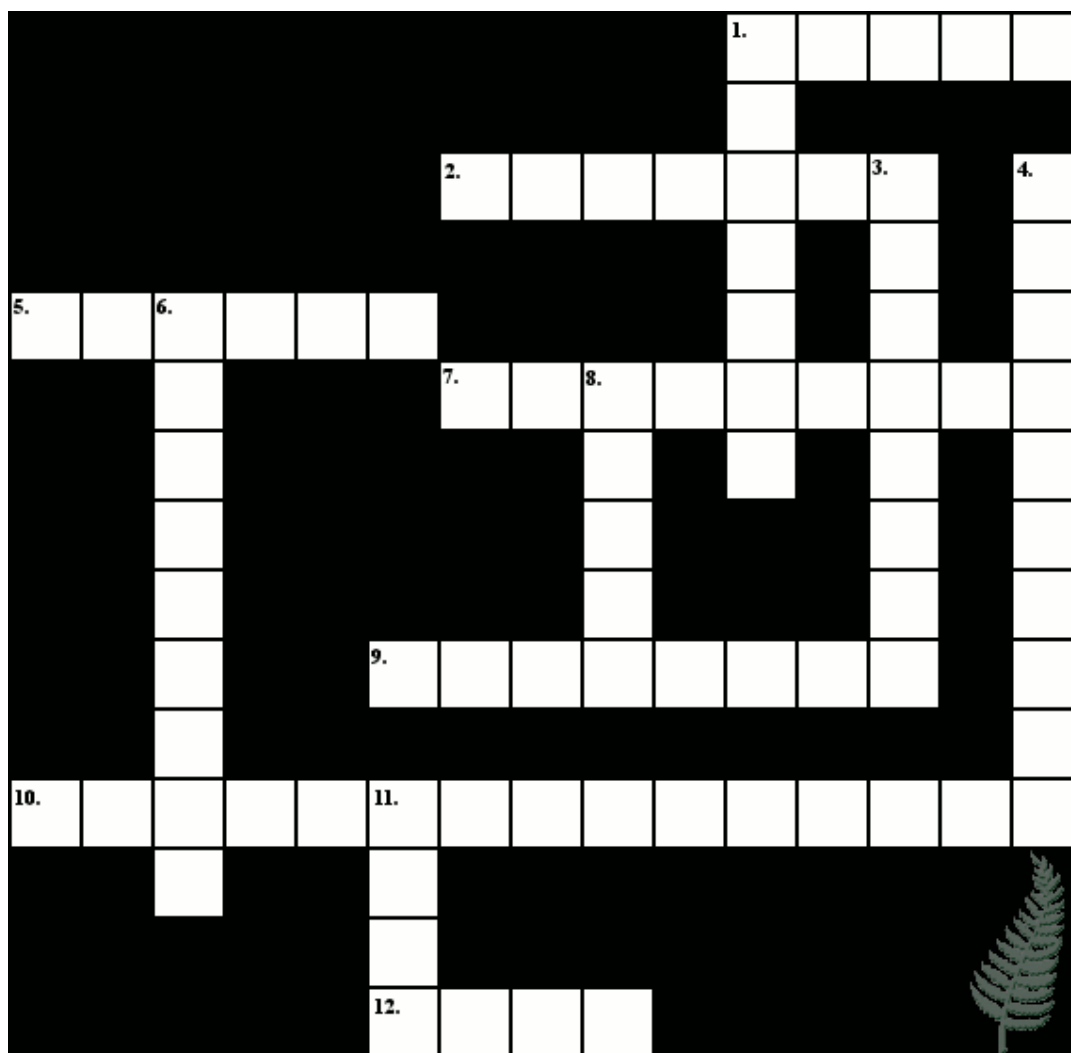


REVERSE CROSSWORD



CLUES ACROSS

1. An argument or row
2. A usually rubber sandal with a strip between the big and second toe
5. Colloquial noun for a jockey
7. A transverse ridge in the road to control the speed of vehicles (two words)
9. A suitcase or travelling bag, etc
10. Colloquial abbreviation, a female flight attendant
12. Sells milk, confectionery, sandwiches and, often, basic grocery items, etc.

CLUES DOWN

1. A cloth for washing the face
3. Bask in the sun, especially to tan the body
4. Abbreviation of a person employed to write for or edit a newspaper or journal
6. A portable insulated container for keeping food or drink cool
8. A thick soft quilt with a detachable cover, used instead of an upper sheet and blankets
11. Colloquial abbreviation for a swimming costume (also plural)

There are many varieties of English; New Zealand English is one of them and Australian English is another. This crossword helps us to see how distinctive each variety is and where shared New Zealand and Australian words possibly originated.

The clues are given for Australian English words, you need to figure out the answers to those clues and then find the equivalent words in New Zealand English to put in the crossword grid.
