Regulatory Cooperation in FTAs

The paper considers the topic of the role of free trade agreements (FTAs) in international governance. Many FTAs include extensive provisions providing for regulatory cooperation between the parties, in subject areas ranging from health and safety, to competition, intellectual property, and technical regulations. The paper explores the purpose of these provisions, and considers their use in the context of global governance theory, asking what such theories can tell us about the significance and implications of the trend towards increasing regulatory cooperation in the FTA context.

Tracey Epps is a Senior Trade Law Adviser with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade. She also teaches international trade law for the University of Otago - where she was on the Faculty full time prior to joining the Ministry in December last year. Tracey has an LLM and SJD from the University of Toronto.
