The Solicitor-General will talk about the constitutional and electoral reforms underway in Tonga.

Mr Kefu holds a LLB degree from the University of Waikato, a LLM degree from the Victoria University in Wellington, and a graduate Diploma in Public Sector Management from Massey University. He began working in the Tongan Crown Law Department in 1997 as Assistant Legal Officer and became Crown Counsel in 2000. He was appointed Senior Crown Counsel in 2002, and took up the role of Acting Solicitor-General in July 2008. Mr Kefu was appointed to the role of Solicitor-General in April 2009. He was also appointed to the Tongan Rugby Board in early 2010.
