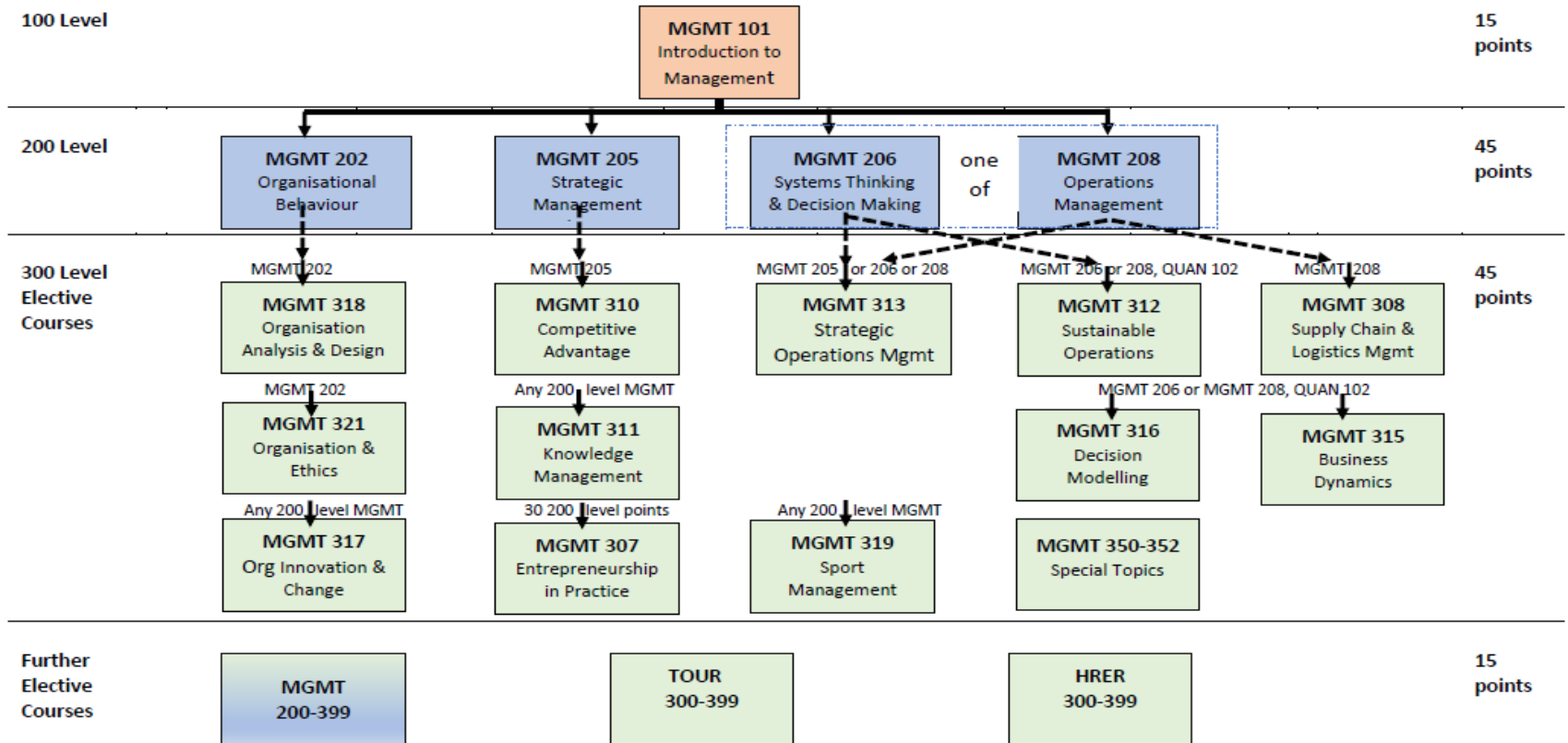

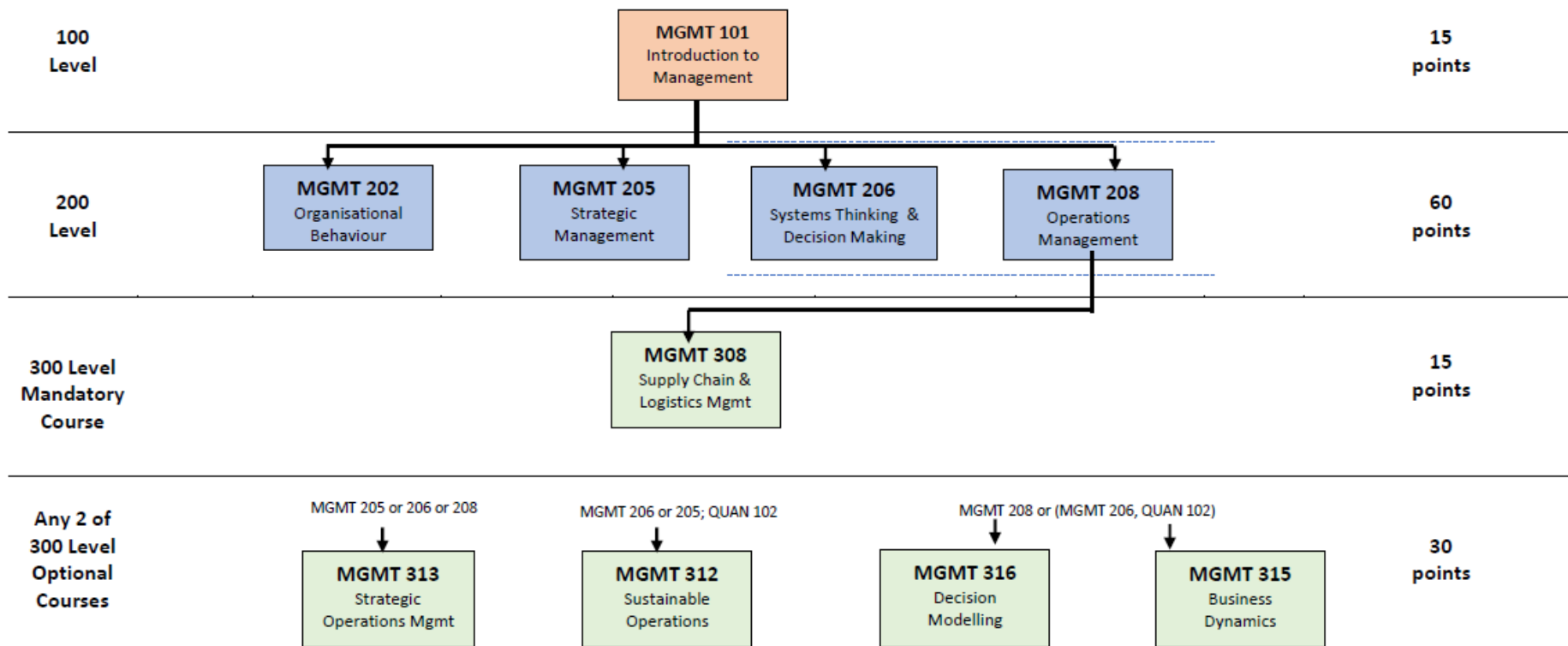

MGMT Minor

- At least 60 points at 200 level and above
 - at least 15 points at 300 level
- A minor is made up of a collection of courses in a particular subject. The workload for a minor is lighter than for a major—fewer courses to do, fewer points required.
