WHO ARE WE LOOKING FOR?

Undergraduate students

Students can go on exchange when they have completed all compulsory courses: LAWS 121, LAWS 122, LAWS 123, LAWS 211, LAWS 212, LAWS 213, LAWS 214, LAWS 297, LAWS 301, and LAWS 312.

Honours students

Students can take only 300-level law courses on exchange. Students must discuss the academic timing of their exchange with the Honours programme coordinator as it is compulsory to complete a full-year 500-level course in their second year of the Honours programme at Te Herenga Waka—Victoria University of Wellington.

Note that exchange courses are counted towards Honours students' GPA.

Postgraduate students

Exchange is not available for Master of Laws students.

How to apply

Step 1: Attend an information session

Information sessions are held weekly during term time at the Kelburn campus.

Step 2: Meet with your student success adviser

Make sure you are aware of what courses are left in your degree, and which ones of those are compatible with studying overseas, by meeting with your adviser and requesting a degree audit.

Step 3: Research possible exchange universities

When submitting your application, you must select three universities and be prepared to go to any one of your choices, as availability is often limited and some Law partners can be harder to get into. Make sure you have looked at the courses of your top choices online to check they align with your degree.

Step 4: Apply online

Submit your application via Pūaha. Do this by selecting 'Services & FAQ > Manage my studies > Apply for Outbound Exchange'.

When to apply

For an exchange in the following year:

- apply by 10 July for Trimester 1
- apply by 1 December for Trimester 2.
