Position purpose

The PASS Mentor will assist in selection and training of PASS Leaders and oversee a group of PASS Leaders (across a range of courses) throughout trimesters 1 and/or 2, acting as role model, observing

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study sessions, providing feedback and relevant knowledge, strategies and skills from their own PASS Leader experience.

Position location

The PASS Mentor role is located within Student Learning *Te Taiako* in Te Pūrengi Student Experience and Wellbeing (SEW) group. Student Learning provides skill and development opportunities for students to optimise their learning experience and is part of the Retention, Achievement and Equity group of SEW. Te Pūrengi Student Experience and Wellbeing provides a range of management, professional and academic services to enhance both the student experience and academic achievement from recruitment through to graduation.

Key responsibilities

PASS Mentor role

Duties for the the role include:

- Oversee small group (6-10) PASS Leaders throughout the trimester
- Provide regular written feedback on each Leader's SharePoint page
- Monitor Leaders' weekly online (Excel) attendance reporting
- Observe Leaders' sessions (before and after mid-tri break)
- Provide ongoing support and advice as required
- Maintain regular communication with Student Learning PASS coordinator

The position entails 3-4 hrs per week on average, to **a maximum of 40 hours** per trimester, as follows:

- PASS mentor training (2 hrs)
- Leader selection interviews (February & July) 2-4 hours
- Leader training (February & July) 2-4 hours
- Informal Leader meetings: before and after mid-tri break (2-3 hrs).
- Responding to Leaders' weekly reports (10-12 hrs).
- Observing PASS sessions, providing feedback (cc to pass-studygroups@vuw.ac.nz); arranging follow up, and liaising with PASS coordinator as required (10-15 hrs)

Key relationships

The PASS Mentors will develop and maintain excellent working relationships with staff in Student Learning, with fellow Mentors and with PASS Leaders.

- Be familiar with the PASS philosophy of active learning and the University's values: akoranga, rangatiranga, whanaungatanga, kaitiakitanga, whai matauranga, and manaakitanga.
